Fifty years ago, in 1976, the theologian and philosopher Klaus Hemmerle published his work *Theses for a Trinitarian Ontology*, which was to mark a turning point in the history of philosophy and theology. In it, he outlines a new way of thinking: Trinitarian ontology, which proposes a radical conception of being in the light of Christian revelation. This perspective has contributed not only to bridging the gap between philosophy and theology, but also to a profound rethinking of the relationship between theology and other fields of knowledge, from a genuinely inter- and transdisciplinary perspective. Today, Trinitarian ontology is increasingly establishing itself as a significant point of reference in philosophical and theological studies, both in Italy and internationally. The main aim of this course is to offer, for the first time, a historical and theoretical overview of Trinitarian ontology, drawing on the contributions of some of the most authoritative contemporary philosophers and theologians on the international scene.

Structure

The Course has a total duration of 40 hours, of frontal teaching:

- **34 hours** delivered via distance learning
- **6 hours** also delivered in person at the Vita-Salute San Raffaele University – UniSR's Milano 2 Campus

Target

The Course is aimed primarily, though not exclusively, at the following groups:
